

# **Committee Reports 2026**

## **Prophora / Litya Bread**

For the majority of the year, prophora baking proceeded as normal, with most of the prophora baked by me at home. With the completion of the parish hall—which includes three dedicated baking spaces and three ovens—we began transitioning baking operations to the church in September. At that time, Jenn and Gabriel joined the prophora baking team, and we completed our first bake in the parish hall. That initial bake went well, as warm weather allowed the dough to behave similarly to prior home bakes, resulting in a consistent outcome.

A second bake was attempted in mid-December with a larger batch of 12 loaves. Due to colder temperatures and environmental differences, the prophora did not turn out as needed for liturgical use. The bread was distributed to parish families for home consumption, and none was wasted.

Since then, I have conducted two additional individual baking sessions at the parish hall to begin fine-tuning the process. This testing period is ongoing, and I anticipate completing two to three more small-batch baking sessions to further refine both the process and ingredients. The goal is to ensure consistent, reliable prophora baking in the future at our new parish hall.

## **Custodial Committee**

In 2025, the main goal of the janitorial committee was to increase access of cleaning supplies to the parish, and to share the burden of cleaning our communal spaces amongst volunteers, instead of just relying on the same people to clean each and every week. In 2026, with having the use of our new parish hall for the entire year, we want to continue to expand these goals as the parish hall space is too large to simply leave cleaning to chance. First, we are hoping to recruit enough volunteers that we have at least 3 cleaning volunteers to clean one week each month. This would be an additional person each week from 2025. Shared burdens make light work. Second, we want to systematize and standardize purchasing and storage of cleaning materials, so that all volunteers have all needed materials, at all times. Lastly, we want to identify or create a space on the church grounds for a dumpster to allow for actual trash service, as our parish is beginning to outgrow the volunteer removal process. In proper execution, we hope to ensure that St. John of Damascus church remains clean and vibrant for all future Orthodox to enjoy.

## **Lawn Maintenance**

The Lawn Maintenance team is responsible for the routine care, seasonal tasks, and ongoing problem prevention of St. John's grounds. Responsibilities include mowing, edging, trimming, and cleaning driveways and sidewalks. The team also manages watering, flower bed maintenance, small tree pruning, and cleanup of downed trees or limbs. Additional duties include cemetery cleanup and maintenance, erosion control, and other tasks necessary to keep the grounds neat, safe, and well maintained.

In 2025, the parish showed increased commitment by assisting with weekly mowing, watering, and flower bed maintenance during the peak summer months. The December parish workday was a great success, and the community is grateful to Terry Cowan for helping keep the grounds around St. John's well maintained.

Ongoing challenges included maintaining flower beds during the peak summer season, particularly with watering needs, as well as the maintenance costs and downtime associated with the zero-turn mower.

Goals for 2026 include adding additional workdays to the calendar and developing a solution for summer watering needs. The team will also plan for expansion and improvements to the cemetery and a new rose garden between the church and hall. A two-year plan will be developed to replace the mower.
